




**I<sup>st</sup> & II<sup>nd</sup> – SEMESTER**

**Observational Visits to Welfare Agencies - 10 Visits**

In the academic year 2024-25, the first-year students of BSW visited various social organizations and government institutions at the highest level to identify the area of society. 10 social and government visits were made. It is known that the students tried to find out more spontaneously and submit reports.

**Field Work Orientation Workshop Programme 2024-25**

## **V<sup>th</sup> & VI<sup>th</sup> – SEMESTER**

### **Concurrent Field work (Community Organization) –**

The college allows BSW third year students to do field work in semester five and semester six, following the social work methodology of community organization and community development. These students carry out field work through Gram Panchayats, various cooperative societies, local NGOs, government, semi-government and private organizations, utilizing the available resources to achieve community development.

Communities can be categorized at scores of levels such as rural, urban, tribal and many more. Every community has its own needs and when these needs are not met, problems, issues and concerns arise. To address these problems social work as a discipline provides a specialized method named community organization. To start practicing community organization, it is necessary to have a clear idea what community organization is, how it works, what are values attached. Various experts of the field have given a set of community organization definitions.

community organization involves working with the community system, and thus requires working at the level of individuals, groups, organizations, community and coalitions. Community organization continuously operates on two levels, the first being making program goals which is acceptable to all the persons involved. Second is the path of constructing, maintaining and extending an organizational base. The ultimate aim of this method is to build 'reinforced' and 'refreshed' communities.

### **Special Awareness Campaign –**

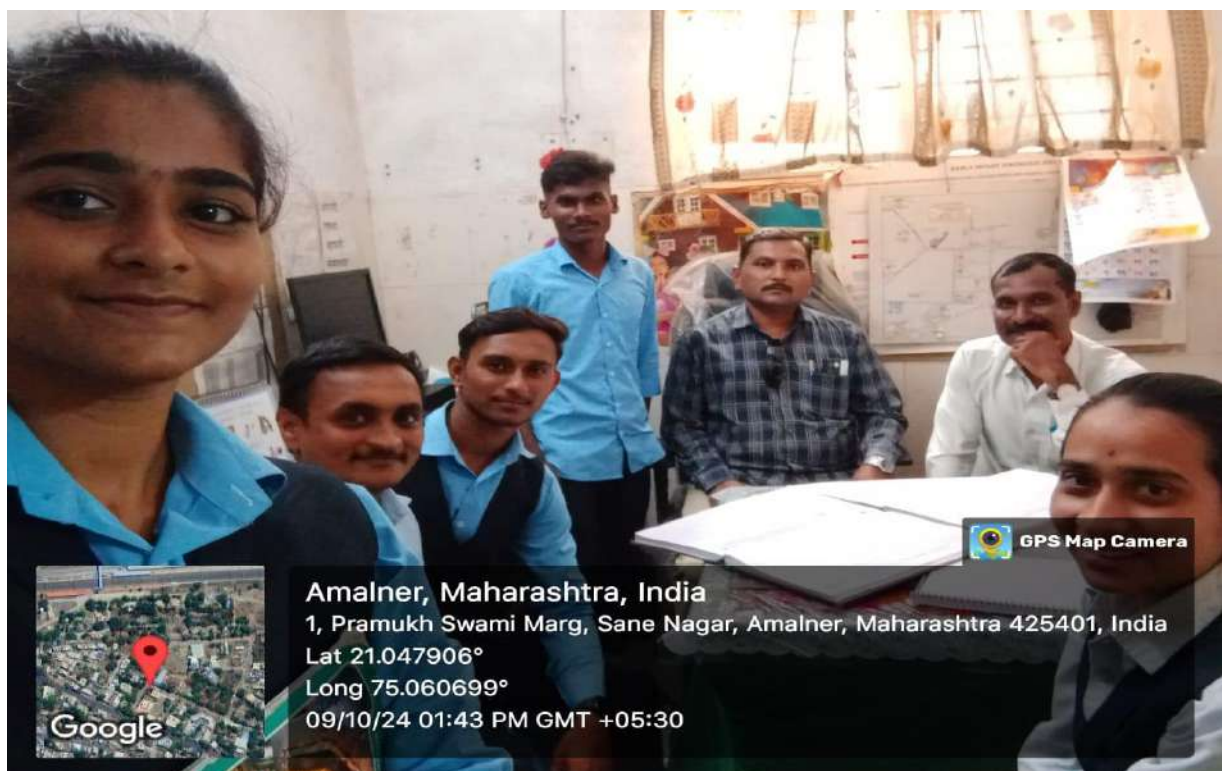
BSW third year students are invited to participate in various government campaigns in semester five and semester six. Awareness campaigns are organized through college students to promote and publicize various government schemes and get them elected to the Lok Sabha. In this, special programs are planned and completed by BSW third year students.

Awareness raising campaigns can be defined as organised communication activities which aim to create awareness on particular topics (health, environment, education), behavioural change among the general population and to improve the focus on better outcomes (better health, greater environmental protection, reduced early school leaving).

## Block Placement –

After the BSW third year students complete their exams, the students are expected to actually go to the field and work in various government, semi-government or voluntary organizations. On that occasion, 26 students from the college were sent for block placement training in and outside the district. The students are expected to adopt all the methods of actual social work there and identify the need for social work education. The supervisors in the college guide them on this.


