The rural sanitation programme in India was introduced in the year 1954 as a part of the First Five Year Plan of the Government of India. The 1981 Census revealed rural sanitation coverage was only 1%. The International Decade for Drinking water and Sanitation during 1981-90, began giving emphasis on rural sanitation. Government of India introduced the Central Rural Sanitation Programme (CRSP) in 1986 primarily with the objective of improving the quality of life of the rural people. Public Sector Cleanliness Campaign and Public Cleanliness Initiative aims to improve rural and urban sanitation, cleanliness, and standard of living. Resource management is an important component of the program. To create clean cities, towns, local government interventions need to focus on solid and waste management. So that people can feel the need for these activities. This requires setting up a system for scientific waste disposal in a manner that has a tangible impact on the population. Community/Gram Panchayats had to be persuaded to come forward through field work and residential camps. From the college level, the work has been continued with the help of the local system in all the places where there is scope for field work.
