SELECTION PROCEDURE

•B.S.W. (40 SEATS)

There will be no entrance test for BSW course. Selection is done as per the marks obtained in last examination and personnel interview. Date of Personal Interview's will be displayed on the notice board of the college.

•M.S.W. (60 SEATS)

Candidates those satisfying the eligibility requirement will be assessed for selection through the following programme.

•Common Entrance Test (CET)

The Entrance test will be conducted by KBC NMU Jalgaon / College as per university norms. The pattern of Exam. is as follows.

A) Written Test-

Written test aims at assessment of knowledge about social issues, current events and sensitivity about social issues and knowledge of English language will be assessed and the time allotted is 60 minutes.

B) Group Discussion-

Group discussion will be held to assers the knowledge and sensitivity on social issues orally to the candidates. The time allotted is 20 minutes.

C) Personnel Interview-

The candidates are also expected to be acquainted with the MSW programme, as the questions may be asked on the topic during the personnel interview. Candidates will be required to come with the original documents and certificates for the interviews before the interview panel. In this entrance, entrance committee have reserve right to do changes.

PAYMENT OF FEES AND OTHER TERMS

- Candidates are required to come prepared to pay the full fees immediately after the admission, if selected. Academic fees for each program are as per the norms of North Maharashtra University and are available on college web-site and college Administrative office. The fees structure may be changed according to Govt. & University guidelines given time to time.
- ♦ Any student, selected as per the final selection list, but failing to pay the full fees by the stipulated date will forfeit his/her claim for the admission to the course.

- ◆ It is compulsory for every candidate to obtain the eligibility certificate as per the rules. The application forms for obtaining the Eligibility Certificates will be made available at the Institute Office and the dates for this will be announced.
- ◆ Application for eligibility certificates are to be sent to the Register, NMU, Jalgaon, along with the migration, transference and passing certificates, and the statement of marks. Timely submission of these certificates is therefore essential. A student who fails to obtain the eligibility certificates will not be permitted to appear at the semester MSW examination of the NMU, Jalgaon.
- The domicile certificate should be submitted by all candidates, compulsorily.
- Non-creamy layer- The ST, OBC, VJNT candidates should submit valid non-creamy layer certificate.

Govt. of India Scholarship students will have to submit valid caste certificate, income certificate, last years Scholarship/Free ship Sanction No. and district change certificate within one month from the date of admission.

As per the "Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act of maharashtra Legislature, received the assent of the Governer on 15th May 1999" the college admistration is strictly followed the guidance of act. If any students found doing Ragging activity in campus or out of the campus that students will be eligibile for punishment under the above act.

Dismissal of Student:

1) Whenever any student or as the case may be, the parent or guardian or teacher of an educational institution complaints in writting of ragging to the head of the educational institution the head of that educational institution shall without prejudice to the foregiving provisions within seven days of the receipt of the complaint enquire into the matter mentioned in the complaint and if prima facie, it is found true, suspend the student who is accused of the offence and shall immediatly forward the complaint to the police station having jurisdiction over the area in which the educational institution is situated for futher action.

2) Where on enquiry by the head of the educational institution it is proved that there is no substance prima facie, in the complaint received under subsection (1) he shall intimate the fact in writting to the complaint.

3) The dicision of the head of the educational institution that the student has indulged in ragging under subsection (1) shall be final.

*Students must keep their terms strichtly in accordance with the rules of the university authorities for grant of term. Terms shall not be granted in case of student who are defaulter.

Any student found guilty of tampering / damping the property fixtures, equipments, furniture, books buildings, vehicles etc. of the college or its sister institutions shall be punishable and shall be liable for expulsion from the College. students are required to make it a habit to see the notice board for keeping, himself well in formed about various happenings and activities taking place in the college. Attendance of students at the lectures will be watched /observed very strictly.

If a students remains absent for a single lecture he will be tracted as absent for the whole day. According to the rule prescribed by the North Maharashtra University the minimum attendance required to be kept by the students is 75 % of the total number of working days. i.e. the days on which lectures are held. Each student must keep the minimum attendance as prescribed by the University. This will be taken as the criteria at the time of filling up of the examination forms.
